Gavriela Logothetou has obtained her bachelor's degree in Chemistry at the Aristotle University of Thessaloniki in Greece, where she was at the "Analytical, Environmental and Physical Chemistry" department, a fact that has given her a solid theoretical background in the analytical techniques and made her eager to improve her skills in the scientific field of Material Analysis.

Before the end of her studies, she underwent an internship at the "Conservation, Chemical-Physical Analysis and Archaeometry Department" of the Archaeological Museum of Thessaloniki in Greece, where she had the opportunity to analyze various metallic coins from the Hellenistic period. This analysis captured her attention and prompted her to seek for a career in the field of Conservation Science.

Afterwards, she graduated from the master "Science for the Conservation & Restoration of Cultural Heritage" at the University of Bologna. In addition, she has finished an internship at the Cultural Heritage Agency of the Netherlands (RCE) in Amsterdam, where she was part of the AMOR project (translated from Dutch, Archaeological Metal Surface Research), which focused on the analysis and conservation of precious metals after excavation. Now, she is a PhD student at the Laboratory of Archaeometry at the University of the Peloponnese and her main research interest addresses to the physical-chemical analysis and the provenance study of archaeological metals.
