

Dr. Georgios Rigas studied Mass Media, Journalism and Culture in the Panteion University of Athens. After showing a distinct inclination towards Modern History and Oriental Languages got a scholarship from IKY (Greek State Scholarships Foundation) on the field of Arab Studies with which he was granted the opportunity to carry out successfully Post-Graduate and Doctoral studies in the Islamic and Middle Eastern Studies department of the University of Edinburgh. After the completion of his PhD research he was involved in various projects under the auspices of the Hellenic Open University, the University of the Aegean, and the University of the Peloponnese respectively.
